Two of the soldiers besides receiving a severe besting were deprived of their muskets; they were brought into Killaloe on a car. Henry Brady, of Raheen, Esq. is using every exertion for the apprehension of those sellows, and from his influence in the country, we trust it will have the desired effect. Mr. Brady had an inquest held on the body of this unfortunate man, by Thomas Sampson, Esq and a verdict of " Wilful Marder," was returned against some persons as yet maknewn.
