The Society of Artists of Dublin will open their annual Exhibition of Paintings, &c. &c. on Monday the 3d of May.

At an examination lately held in Dublin University, the Premiums bestowed by his Grace, the Lord Archbishop of Armagh, Lord Primate of all Ireland, for the promotion of the Hebrew Language, were adjudged to the undernamed Students, Bachelors of Arts:—Hicks, Walsh, Tyrrell, Kennedy, King, Lefanu, and Hughes.

The Quarterly Examinations at Trinity College, Dublin, for the Classes of Senior Sophisters and Senior Freshmen, will be held on Monday and Tuesday the 3d and 4th of May; and on Thursday and Friday the 6th and 7th of May for the Classes of Junior Sophisters and Junior Freshmen.

Yesterday se'nnight, Mr. James Mahon, Revenue Officer, proceeded from Killaloe, Co. Clare, with a party of the 6th Garrison Battalion, stationed there for the purpose of preventing private distillation, to Derrygolden, County Galway; after a great deal of exertions, he succeeded in detecting two Stills and a Worm, and destroyed a considerable quantity of malt. On the return of this party to Killaloe, they were surrounded by a mob of about 400 fellows, who rescued the stills and worm, seized by this active Officer; three or four of those fellows made off with the stills, &c. and the remainder immediately insisted on having the informer, a man of the name of Michael Quin, who was dressed in Military clothing, as a disguise, delivered up to them, and on the military hesitating to do so, they swore they would murder every soldier if they made the least delay; he was then pointed out, when he received a blow of a stone on the side of the head, which in an instant deprived him of existence; they afterwards mangled his body in a shocking manner. Two of the soldiers besides receiving a severe beating were deprived of their muskets; they were brought into Killaloe on a car. Henry Brady, of Raheen, Esq. is using every exertion for the apprehension of those fellows, and from his influence in the country, we trust it will have the desired effect. Mr. Brady had an inquest held on the body of this unfortunate man, by Thomas Sampson, Esq. and a verdict of "Wilful Murder," was returned against some persons as yet unknown.

Mr Mahon, the Revenue Officer, can identify a number of these fellows, among whom, we are very happy to say, is the principal, who threw the stone. A shot fired by one of the military wounded a man slightly in the shoulder.

Wednesday evening John Shaughnessy, a farmer at Lisanaite, in the Liberties, returning from this City, fell from his horse and was unfortunately killed. An Inquest was held on the body by the Mayor on Thursday—Verdict, Accidental Death.

Yesterday morning, Edward Neville, of Tralee, returning from this City in a sail boat to Blennerville, county Kerry, in tacking opposite Arthur's Quay, the boom struck him with such violence, that he fell overboard, and was drowned—the body has not yet been found.

Yesterday, the Right Worshipful Mayor received from two Tholsel Jurics, 2s. 9d. for the use of the 36 unhappy Lunatics in the Hospital of the House of Industry.
