Charles Jacob, Esq. is appointed Mayor of Waterford, for the ensuing year.

The Lord Bishop of Waterford will hold his Annual Visitation at Waterford, on the 5th August, and at Clonmel, for the Diocese of Lismore, on the 15th August.

Sunday last, seven convicts, four men and three women, passed through this City, from Castlebar, on their way to Cork, for Botany Bay.

Saturday evening, a boy between 11 and 12 years old, the son of Patrick McInerney, of Mary-street, fell into the river near the new gaol, and was unfortunately drowned.

A grand entertainment, by the Citizens of Waterford, is given this day, in honor of the Marquis of Wellington's Victory.

The Rev. William D. Hoare, as Treasurer to the Limerick Branch of the London Society for promoting Christianity amongst the Jews, received on Monday last, from Lady O'Brien, seven Guineas, five as a donation, and two as an annual subscription, for said Institution.

Several Gentlemen and Ladies of this City have formed a Penny Society, for the above laudable purpose—Such a plan having been strenuously recommended by the Rev. William Vessie, who, on Sunday se'nnight, at the new Presbyterian Meeting House, in this City, delivered an excellent suitable discourse about the intentions of the London Society, when a collection was made, which with individual subscriptions amounted to about £35, in aid of this Institution:—He enlarged on the subject, stating that the present object was to endeavor to reclaim several Jewish females, who were destitute and otherwise abandoned in the metropolis of the Empire, and to promote a Seminary, in which upwards of 100 children, originally of the same persuasion, were also to be instructed in the principles of Christianity.

The Rt. Worshipful Mayor yesterday handed over to the Steward of the Lunatic Hospital, £1 6s. fines levied by his Worship on different persons conveying Timber through the streets across cars, contrary to law;—also, to the Dispensary, 10s. fines inflicted by him on butchers, for fraudulently blowing and greasing meat.

Monday, the Right Worshipful Andrew Watson, Esq. Mayor, held an inquest on the body of James Ryan, a lad 19 years old, who, on that day, at Bohenreen, in the South Liberties, was driving a horse and car, with milk vessels, furiously, whereby he was thrown from the animal, and died in a few moments:—The Jury brought in a Verdict accordingly.
