According to the latest accounts, the Tipperary Regiment expected to be landed at Monkstown, and are now on duty in Cork.

The Fermanagh militia are to do duty in Fermanagh, Westmeath in Tuam, and Berkshire in Galway. Transports are daily expected round from the coast, to the Isle of Wight, for the purpose of taking on board many detachments at the depot there, in their several regiments in North America.

Parliament which stood prorogued to the 23d has been further prorogued to the 4th of Oct. His Grace the Lord Lieutenant has been pleased to appoint Lieut. Gen. Archdall a Governor of the County Fermanagh.

Lord Whitworth, the new Lord Lieutenant, was yesterday expected to make his entry into the Metropolis of this Country.

The City of Dublin was brilliantly illuminated on Monday Night, in consequence of the official account of the late signal Victories in Spain.
