der of the Forces who is daily expected there—  
We hear that Sir John is also to visit this City, and  
to inspect the several Regiments in Garrison, with  
the Yeomanry, &c.

sit, previous to his departure from this Country.

The Brother-in-law of the gallant Wellington, the  
Hon. and Rev. Mr. Pakenham, arrived in Cork on  
Wednesday.

At the Annual Visitation of the Clergy of this  
Diocese, on Wednesday last, the Lord Bishop re-  
commended, in the most forcible and impressive  
manner, to the Ministers of the various parishes,  
to use their exertions, in promoting the objects of  
the Limerick Branch of the Hibernian Bible Society,  
to endeavour to procure Subscriptions in their re-  
spective vicinities, and to obtain such a list of Sub-  
scribers as, by their number and influence, may ex-  
tend the circulation of the Scriptures.

On Friday night, Mr. Molony, Officer of Excise,  
under the direction of William Roche, Esq. Inspec-  
tor General of Limerick District, proceeded with a  
Serjeant and twelve of the King's Dragoon Guards,

ed two extensive private Distilleries, which they

the Sligo Regt. destroyed a private distillery on  
Thursday night, near Abingdon, and lodged a still,  
head and worm in the King's Stores.

Yesterday, information on Oath being given to

whom were armed with guns, having on Thursday  
night attacked the house of Patrick Kane, at Barna-  
coyle, in this County, (near the Suburbs of this City),  
fired into the same and tore down some trees in his

Constable, with a Serjeant's Guard of Dragoons,  
who, same evening, brought in two of the persons  
sworn against, namely, Michael Higgins and Michael  
Dillon, who were committed to Jail by his Worship.
