Yesterday evening, the Right Rev. Lord Bishop of Limerick arrived at the See House, in this City, from Dublin.

On Monday last, at a meeting of the Roman Catholic Clergy, the Rev. Charles Tuohy, Dean of Limerick, P. P. of Rathkeale, was elected Vicar Capitular of the Diocese of Limerick.

In consequence of a combination entered into by the Labourers in the neighbourhood of Meelick not to work but at very advanced rates, Francis Lloyd, Esq. a Magistrate of the County Clare, on Monday last, took a number of the Sligo Regiment from this Garrison, to cut down several fields of Corn, &c. (belonging to industrious farmers, in that neighbourhood, who would not accede to the exorbitant demand, the work was effectually done by the troops, who shewed themselves expert at the sickle, and returned to town that evening after reaping and saving to a considerable extent. This unexpected exertion has already been productive of advantage, as the high tone of the peasantry is altered, and the obligations which they pledged to each other, not to work for certain persons in that part of the country are dissipated, the deluded labourers now being disposed to do the harvest business at terms which we understand were offered, and had been considered by persons of judgment as fair and liberal.

Monday night, a man named Michael Lillis, from Kiltrush, stepping into a boat at the Long Dock, fell into the river and was unfortunately drowned.

On Saturday last, a large range of Offices belonging to the ancient residence of the Gabbert family, at Caherline, in this County, the property of the High Sheriff, was burnt by some cottagers drying flax.

The valuable Horse which was stolen from the stable of the Rev. John Graves, of Fortwician, in this County, on Friday se'night, has been recovered (in consequence of the advertisement, announcing the robbery, having appeared in this Chronicle on the day following.) by a Gentleman, near Kilworth, Co. Cork, and has been received by Mr. Graves.—We are sorry to find that the Thief has, for the present, eluded justice.

Monday last, the Right Worshipful A. Watson, Esq. Mayor, as Coroner, held an Inquest on the body of Florence McCarthy, who had, at about 2 o'clock on that morning, thrown himself out of one of the windows of St. John's Hospital in this City;—it appeared in evidence, that he was put in the day previous, afflicted with a fever, a straight waistcoat was necessary, from which, by force, he discharged himself, and seizing the instant when one of the nurse-tenders quitted his ward, he sprang from the bed, wrenched off the bars, which were secured by a padlock, and throwing himself out on the yard, he received such injury on his head by the fall, that he immediately expired.—The Jury, without hesitation, brought in their Verdict accordingly, it appearing there was every attention paid him in the Hospital, and the momentary absence of the nursetender arising from her having only gone for the requisite liquors for another Patient in the same Room.
