DIED.—On the 22d of Aug. in the Military Hospi-
tal, near St. Sebastian, aged 29 years, of his wounds
received on the 25th July, while at the head of the
Grenadier Company 1st Bat. 92d Regt. in action with
the enemy at the pass of Roncesvalles, in the Pyren-
nees, Capt. Samuel Bevan, second son of the late
Henry Bevan, of Miltown, in this County, Esq.—
The death of this young Gentleman, who possessed
the most amiable disposition, has been a source of
great affliction to his widowed mother, and very ex-
tensive commiseration:—He entered the army at the age
of 16 years and has ever since been engaged in actual
service—was present at most of the principal engage-
ments in Egypt, Walcheren, Spain and Portugal, and
on the late occasion having received many severe
wounds, his right arm was (in consequence) ampu-
tated from the shoulder, on the 15th of August, and
on the 22d he expired—the pain of the operation,
added to the weak state of his body, occasioned by
the fatigues and privations suffered during the late
Campaigns, having brought on a fever which termi-
nated his existence.—At Seafeld, the Lady of Thos.

illness with the greatest resignation, and whose death
