### OF KING'S BENCH, NOV. 16.

THE KING v. JOHN MAGEE.  
The Attorney-General prayed, that their Lordships would  
have this case called on.

Mr. O'Connell, on behalf of the defendant, moved  
that the Court would be pleased to set aside the verdict  
in this cause, inasmuch as the Jury who tried  
the case had not been regularly and duly impaneled,  
and sworn. This was the first ground of  
objection. The second ground was, that the said Jury  
had not duly returned upon a second venire, issued  
under one had been issued and actually returned;  
and that his motion in the third place, upon the  
insufficient and legal evidence of the fact of pub-  
lication of the defendant, within the County of the City  
of Dublin on the day laid. These grounds were sup-  
ported by an affidavit of the defendant, and a reference  
to the records of the Court; and were enlarged upon  
with felicity and force by Mr. O'Connell. After  
the conclusion of an argument which occupied nearly  
two hours, Mr. John Sealey Townsend rose to reply  
and acquitted himself with much ingenuity.—  
The Court adjourned the further hearing until this day.  
The case excited much public interest; the Court  
was crowded to excess at an early hour.

The Court was yesterday occupied with hearing  
the case, when, after a long argument  
by the Attorney-General and Mr. O'Connell—The  
Court ordered, that Mr. Magee should be brought  
up for trial.

### KILKENNY RESOLUTIONS.

The Attorney-General stated, that an indictment had  
been returned by the Grand Jury against Mr. Magee, for  
publishing a libel as he was then judicially in the presence of  
the Court, and requested that he might be ordered to plead.  
The Attorney-General declared that they had not the  
power to grant this motion, and prayed that time might  
be given for the Attorney-General to prepare his case.

The Attorney-General said, it was essential to the  
public interest, that a day in the present term should be  
set apart for the trial, and therefore desired that Mr. Magee  
should be brought up forthwith.  
The Court on Friday was requested.
