The Royal West Middlesex regiment lately in Ire-  
land, have turned out for service under the Marquis  
of Wellington.

Three hundred recruits for the 3d West York re-  
giment, quartered at Middleton, are stationed at  
Doncaster, waiting the arrival of the regiment in  
England.—Captain Brookbank, of the 3d West  
York, is appointed Major, vice Benson, cashiered.

The Northumberland regiment have replaced the  
Royal Lanark, at Newcastle upon-Tyne.—The latter  
have marched for Norman Cross.

The 2d battalion of the 47th regiment, now with  
Lord Wellington, does not amount to 100 effectives.

A draft for the 101st regiment, raised in the Co.  
Mayo, under the command of Lieutenant Naghtin,  
arrived, on Monday, at the Isle of Wight, from the  
depot at Hull.

The 87th Regt has been ordered from Gibraltar,  
to join Lord Wellington

The 12th Regt. Infantry, has been so fortunate in  
getting recruits from the Militia, that an augmentation  
of four companies has been ordered to take  
place to its 2d Batt. now quartered at Clononey  
Barracks, near Banagher. At present it consists of  
750 fine young fellows, and we have no doubt will  
soon be actively employed.

**MELANCHOLY ACCIDENT.**—About three o'Clock in  
the afternoon of Sunday, a distressing circumstance  
occurred in Mass Lane, near Thomond-gate. James  
Spellicy, a Quarryman, inadvertently placed some  
camp gun-powder in a metal pot, in order to dry it,  
when a spark communicating with it, it exploded,  
by which the house was blown up;—Spellicy was  
dreadfully burnt, as was his wife Mary, an infant  
about 6 months old, Michael Conway and Bridget  
Enright, (who lay buried under the ruins for an hour).  
They were all taken to the County Infirmary—the  
infant died on Monday, and faint hopes are enter-  
tained for the recovery of the others.

London, and at Plymouth.—We understand
