General Donkin is appointed Assistant Adjutant-General in Ireland, vice Colonel Murray.

On Monday, a General Court Martial is to assemble in this City, for the trial of such military persons as may be brought before it—Lieutenant-Colonel Whitmore, 54th Regiment, is to be President, and Captain Gladwin, Deputy Judge Advocate.

Lieutenant John Evans Taylor, of the 51st Regt. who was killed at St. Pe, was second son to the late Anselm Taylor, of Woodcliff, Esq. in the Co. of Limerick, and brother to Lieut. Anselm Taylor, late of the 9th Foot, who was wounded in the lungs at Barossa, on that account was transferred to the 12th Dragoons, to which Regt. he now belongs, and was wounded at the siege of Badajoz in the arm, under which wound he suffers much—his brother's death is a severe affliction to his family, as he was a most amiable young man.

On Thursday, a farmer was brought before the Mayor, and convicted of twice selling the same corn; his Worship awarded the corn to the first buyer, and fined the farmer forty shillings.

Tuesday night, Doctor Korman, of Cork, returning from near Bandon to that City in a chaise, in consequence of the impetuosity of a stream of water at Ardaraestig, the chaise was carried into the River, and melancholy to add, the Doctor and the Coachman were drowned.
