We are informed, that on Monday last, being the
Fair day of Six-Mile-Bridge, Co. Clare, rioting com-
menced at two o'clock—about four o'clock, Com-
menced from Cratloe and the adjacent mountains, amounting
to near five hundred men, began bogging every one
before them, and came up near the post-office of
Town, where they were met by Capt. D'Alton and
a detachment of the Ross-Castle infantry, who im-
mediately read the Riot Act, and ordered the infantry
to charge them with the bayonet, which was done
steady and determined, which forced the different
Clans to give way and quit the streets, and a number
of them were taken and lodged in the bridewell of
Six-Mile-Bridge—picquets constantly paraded the
streets the whole of the night, till all was quiet.
