Most of the Kilkenny Militia, quartered at Har-

The Dorset Militia, cantoned in the County Kerry,

On Sunday last, Lieut-General Gordon arrived in
Kilkenny, having been appointed to the command
of that district.
The last India Gazette contains dispatches from
our townsman, Sir Gore Duseley, the British Mi-
nister at the Court of Persia, which state, that the
war between the Russians and Persians was carried
on with unabated animosity and with various suc-
cess.—The British Officers in the service of Persia,
were placed in a most embarrassing predicament, in
consequence of the restoration of peace between Gt.
Britain and Russia, but they felt themselves bound
in honor not to abandon the cause in which they
were engaged.—We feel regret in adding, that in an
action in which the Persians were completely sur-
prised and defeated, that distinguished officer, Major
Christie lost his life, through the obstinacy of the
Persian Commander.
The passengers that arrived here yesterday in the
mail-coach from Dublin, state, that at the time of
their departure, a report was prevalent, that an ex-
press was received at the Castle, announcing another
defeat of Soult, near Bayonne, in which the French
lost 50,000.—The British had a General killed and
another wounded.—The account, if correct, will be
confirmed by the arrival of the mail this afternoon,
and which we shall give in a second Edition.
