it appears that no movement of military importance had taken place; but on the 31st inst. the enemy having collected a force on the Grave, drove in the British picquets; turned the right of Major-Gen. Buchan's Portuguese brigade, and established two divisions of infantry on the height of La Bashdi. On the 6th inst. the 3d and 4th divisions under Sir Thos. Buchan and Sir Lowry Cole, supported by General D'Almeida's Portuguese brigade and the cavalry under General Fane, dislodged the enemy without loss on our side, and our posts were replaced where they had been before."

An order has been received for 450 privates and a proportionate number of officers, of the 2d battalion 88th, to embark at Cork, to join their distinguished Regiment, under Lord Wellington.—The 2d battalion, quartered at Fermoy, consists of 850 men, raised within these last two months, by volunteers from the Irish and English Militia.

The 2d West York and East Suffolk regiments have received orders to embark for Ireland.

The Leitrim Militia have marched from Cavan and Bellefleur to Boyle, Co. Roscommon.

The Meeting of the Magistrates, which was to be held at Clonmel, on Wednesday last, relative to the outrages committed in the County Tipperary, is postponed in consequence of the inclemency of the weather.

The Magistrates & inhabitants of Killarney have voted Thanks to Major Still, and the Dorset Regiment, for their excellent conduct whilst stationed there.

On Sunday night, the Rev. Standish Grady, of Elton, a Magistrate of this County, with a detachment of six privates from the Sligo militia, quartered at Hospital, went in pursuit of the fellows concerned in the robbery committed in Mr Grady's house, on the 4th inst.—On their route, two shots were fired, without effect, at the military, who returned the shots at the villains who fled.—We understand that there is every probability in the fellows concerned in the outrage and attempt at assassination, being shortly brought to condign punishment.

Thursday night, Patrick Murnane, returning from this City, to his Master's, Joseph Gubbins, Esq. of Kenmare-Castle, in this County, was attacked at the Hill of Ardmore, in the Liberties, by a set of fellows, who beat him in so inhuman a manner, with stones and sticks, that he died in less than two hours after, at the four roads of Ballineety—No cause can be assigned for this most wanton outrage; the deceased was an inoffensive, honest man.

Darby Quine, of Fedamore, a brother-in-law of the above Murnane, on hearing, yesterday morning, of his murder, was so sensibly affected, that he died immediately of the fright.
