The same day, being impanelled, to try the other allegations, notwithstanding a challenge to the jury was offered to them, the Counsel for the Plaintiff withdrew from the Court, and suffered judgment by default, to go against them, which leaves the subject open to another trial, and can, in any manner, decide the question, except as it respects the two individuals concerned.
