June last.

The Lord High Chancellor of Ireland has appointed
Tha. Richard Ryan, Esq. of Scarteen, a Magistrate
of the Counties of Limerick and Tipperary.

It is stated that the Right Hon. Secretary
Peel intends to bring forward in the next meeting of
Parliament, an Amendment to the Irish Convention
Act, by constituting any assembly or meeting illegal,
that is not convened by the Sheriff or some other
Magistrates.

The Right Hon. John Ormsby Vandoeur passed
through this City, yesterday, from Dublin, for his
estate at Kilrush.

This day, Colonel Crosbie M. P. arrived here from
Dublin, on his way to attend the County Kerry
Assizes.

Yesterday, the Right Hon. William Fitz-Gerald,
M. P. Chancellor of the Exchequer, passed through
this City, from the County Clare, for London.

Monday last, the Master of the Rolls left this
City for Dublin.

Counsellor Joy is the Law Serjeant, in the place
of the Master of the Rolls.

The following convictions have taken place in the
City and County Courts, since the commencement
of our Assizes—

In the City—Dennis Molony for the murder of
John Magrath, man-slaughter, to be imprisoned 12
months—Ann Keogh, for stealing wearing apparel,
the property of James McCarthy; not sentenced—

William Price, a Constable, for robbing Mary Egan
of 1l. 14s. 1½d.; also robbing Eleanor Neville, of
8l. 7s. 7d. guilty in both cases—James Schofield,
sen for coining, not sentenced—John Meehan, for
the murder of John Hickey, man-slaughter.

In the County—Patrick Hickey for the murder of
Thomas Hayes, convicted of manslaughter, sentenc-
ed to 12 months imprisonment—William O'Brien,
for manslaughter, sentenced to three months impris-
onment—Michael Walsh, Thomas Corbett, and
Thomas Mulvihill, for assembling by night in the
vicinity of Shanagolden, and wearing unlawful
badges.—Sentence not passed.

The Sligo Assizes have ended without a capital
conviction.

The Co. Waterford Assizes have proved maiden.

At said Assizes, an Action of Covenant for £1000
was brought by J. W. Wall, Esq. against Michael
Byrne, Esq. of Dublin, and Henry Briscoe, Esq. of
Tinvane, Assignees of Messrs. White of Carrick, for
alleged delapidations to the premises of Carrickbeg.—
after a trial which occupied considerable time, and
the Jury three hours deliberation, they returned a
Verdict of £50 Damages and 6d. Costs.

Ten persons have received sentence of death at
Meath, for robbery, &c.; Drogheda Assizes have
proved maiden, as have also, Ennis; several convic-
tions have taken place at Mullingar—two are sen-
tenced to death at Wexford.
