The Sligo Assizes have ended without a capital conviction.

The Co. Waterford Assizes have proved maiden. At said Assizes, an Action of Covenant for 1000 was brought by J. W. Wall, Esq. against Michael Byrne, Esq. of Dublin, and Henry Briscoe, Esq. of Tinvane, Assignees of Messrs. White of Carrick, for alleged delations to the premises of Carrickbeg.—after a trial which occupied considerable time, and the Jury three hours deliberation, they returned a Verdict of 150 Damages and 6d. Costs.

Ten persons have received sentence of death at Meath, for robbery, &c.; Drogheda Assizes have proved maiden, as have also, Ennis; several convictions have taken place at Mullingar—two are sentenced to death at Wexford.

On Friday, there is to be a meeting of the Roman Catholics of the Co. Kildare, to take into consideration the conduct of Captain Bryan, on the trial of Mr. Magee.

The Election for the County of Kildare is fixed for the 25d Instant, at Athy—there will not be any opposition to the return of Lord Wm. Fitz-Gerald, brother of the Duke of Leinster.

A meeting of the Magistrates of the King's Co. was yesterday held at Philipstown, when several spirited Resolutions were entered into, very likely to put down the shameful disturbances existing in that County.

Nine fellows concerned in nightly meetings and assemblies, under the factious name of Threshers, were on yesterday week, capitally convicted at the Assizes of Roscommon. Several others have put off their trials. The Grand Jury of the Co. Roscommon have returned thanks to E. S. Hickman, Esq. Crown Solicitor of the Connaught Circuit, for his unwearied exertions in bringing the disturbers of the peace in that County to punishment.—It is understood that a Special Commission for the trial of the Co. Roscommon threshers will be held on the 20th April.

Monday morning, Timothy Shanahan, of Killinanan, was found dead in his bed, at his lodging in Bruff—two persons who slept with him on Sunday night, were detained in custody, until the decision by a Coroner's inquest was known, which was held yesterday by Charles Bennett, Esq. Coroner, and a verdict returned, "died by excess of drinking Whiskey."

John Cox, Esq. a Coroner of this County, held an inquest, last week, at Kiltenny, on the body of Jas. Donovan, when the Jury returned a verdict, that he died in consequence of a kick in the stomach he received from William Fowlue, and violence on his part from persons unknown—Mr Cox was assisted by the Rev. John Graves and Captain Michael Martin, both Magistrates of this County. The Dr. who, for this part, sailed from London on the 1st inst. last.
