Pat. Hickey—for the murder of Thomas Hayes, at Murroe, guilty of manslaughter, to be burned on the hand and imprisoned 12 months.

Benjamin Donovan—for same crime, to be burned in the hand, and imprisoned 6 months.

Andrew Young—for a violent assault on George Leake, Esq. to be imprisoned 6 months, and give security to keep the peace.

Cornelius Bray—for riot and assault, fined 6d. and to be imprisoned one month.

Michael Welsh and Thomas Corbett—for assembling by night, and wearing unlawful badges, fined 6d. each, and to be imprisoned; the former 3 months & the latter 6.

Thomas Mulvihill—for the same offence, fined 6d. and to be imprisoned 6 months.

John Lee and Michael Fitzgerald—for assembling at night, fined 6d. and to be imprisoned one month.

William O'Brien—for the murder of Daniel Ryan, manslaughter, burned in the hand, and to be imprisoned 3 months.

Jer. Buckley—for the murder of Thomas Ryan, manslaughter, burned in the hand, and to be imprisoned 12 months.

Darby Cleary—for the same, burned in the hand, and to be imprisoned 6 months.

James Heffernan—for the same, burned in the hand, and to be imprisoned 3 months.

James O'Brien—for the same, burned in the hand, and imprisoned 3 months.

John Dee—for perjury, in swearing, on a trial, contrary to the information he swore before a Magistrate, fined 20l. and to be imprisoned 6 months.
