In consequence of information which reached
Ballyneguard, of John Quaine being at the hill of
Fedamore, who was charged with the murder of
Michael Gleeson, of Ballymaistradeen, on the 13th
Feb. last, Edward Croker, Esq. his son the Rev.
Edward Croker, and Arthur Gethin Creagh, Esq.
went yesterday at two o'clock and detected the
offender, who had hitherto evaded justice, he was
