The Chancellor of the Exchequer, on Thursday last, in the House of Commons, in reply to a question put to him by Mr. Huskisson, relative to the sinking Fund, stated "That in one respect it was the intention of Government to propose an increase of expenditure—The country owed a vast debt of gratitude to our brave Army and Navy, for those glorious efforts, by which the contest in which we had engaged, was at length brought to a successful termination—That debt ought to be in some degree diminished, by an attention to the comforts of those gallant men, and it was therefore, in contemplation to propose an increase in their half-pay"

The brig Amity which has arrived here from Ayr, was chased into Broadhaven, last week, by an American schooner privateer which captured a sloop in sight of the Amity.

The brig Edward, Capt. Phillips, which was captured off the Skelligs Rocks, on the 27th ult. by the Lawrence American privateer, No. 795, arrived in this port yesterday from Castletown, where her arrival was stated in our Chronicle of Wednesday last; her cargo consisting of flaxseed was most maliciously damaged by the Americans.
