In the House of Lords on Monday, Counsel were heard, and judgment was affirmed in *M. Namara v. Gore*.

We were correct in stating last post, that the 6th and 8th regiments sailed from Bourdeaux for the river St. Laurence—We have since received letters from Bourdeaux, which mention that the above regiments proceeded direct for Quebec, on the 3d inst. and that they were to be followed by several other battalions in the vicinity of Bourdeaux.

The Gentlemen and Freeholders of the County of Tipperary, at a respectable meeting held in Clonmel on Saturday last, have adopted the resolutions passed by the Meeting in the Queen's County, relative to the Corn Laws.

The Roman Catholic Clergy of the diocese of Cork intend meeting on Friday next, at the North Parish Chapel, in that City, to take Quarantotti's letter into consideration.

His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant has ordered all issue of Spring Practice, or other ammunition to the Yeomanry, to be suspended for the present.

The brig Fidelity of North Shields, Capt. Staunton, from Passages, with cattle, was captured off Baltimore harbour, Co. Cork, on Wednesday, by the American schooner, Surprise, of 311 tons, and mounting ten 18 pounders—she also captured the John and James, of Dundee, from same place, also with cattle, but she relinquished her to the crew, who reached Skibbereen the same evening.

The Triennial Visitation of the Diocese of Limerick, is fixed by his Grace the Lord Arch-Bishop of Cashel, for Tuesday, the 28th of June.

This day, James Hewett Massy Dawson, Esq. arrived in this City, having been for some days on a visit at Massy Park, the seat of the Hon. John Massy.

The Yeomanry Corps of the County of Limerick have addressed Major Harding, expressing their perfect approbation of his conduct for these sixteen years that he has been their Brigade-Major, and requesting his acceptance of a piece of Plate, value One Hundred Guineas, as a mark of their respect and esteem.

Wednesday, an Inquest was held by Robert Smithwick, of Wilton, Esq. a Magistrate of this County, on the body of Mrs. Halloran, wife of Michael Halloran, of Capperullen, when it appeared that she came by her death, the day previous, in consequence of being attacked by a cow, which wounded her so horribly, that instantaneous dissolution took place.

A woman named Bridget Cassidy, otherwise Carthy, who has been for some time notorious for stealing fowl but happened to escape prosecution, having been yesterday detected in her old practice, was by order of the Right Worshipful Thomas F. Wilkinson, Esq. Mayor, beheaded thro' this City with the stolen fowl about her neck, and then sent to the House of Industry by order of his Worship, where she is to remain, and the public will be relieved from her depredations.
