On the embarkation of the Russian troops at Cher-
gign for England, some hundreds of their horses were
up to sale, and purchased by the French Govern-
ment.

A Cardinal arrived in town on Saturday morning,
charged with an important Mission from his Holiness
Pope to the Court of London.

The contract for the Loan entered into this morning,
least has given genuine satisfaction to the contractors
and their Friends, as may easily be supposed when it is
known, that during the whole of the day it has borne, a
fluctuating premium of between five and seven per
cent.

Reduced Annuities closed at 69 3-4th, and Consols
for the account at 72. The latter rose to 72 about
noon.

The Governor and Deputy Governor of the Bank,
and the parties who had prepared lists for the Loan,
were invited by appointment this morning upon the First
Floor of the Treasury and the Chancellor of the Ex-
chequer. The bidding, as our readers know, was to
be in the 3 per cents. All the lists made a similar offer,
viz 22l. 10s. 3 per cents. The offer was accepted by
the First Lord of the Treasury and the Chancellor
of the Exchequer. Upon the return into the city, the
loan was instantly at premium 5½, 6½, 7½, 7½.

The Loan is £24,000,000, for the service of the year 1814.
The duty on Wine which is to be taken off, will
be very inconsiderable.

Sugars have already fallen 25 per cent. in conse-
quence of the arrival of the large West India Fleet
on Saturday—a farther reduction is also expected.—
Teas are also on the decline, the East India Fleet
having brought vast supplies, and no shipments for
the Continent.

Lord Cochrane's Counsel will move to morrow for a
new trial, and in the event of a refusal, for an arrest of
judgment.

Lord Auckland will succeed his late Father as Au-
thor of Greenwich Hospital.

The Pope is raising a strong corps of Cavalry for his
States.—The peasants voluntarily furnished the required
number of horses.

The departure of the Royal visitors is fully fixed for
the 24th inst.

The different Colonies ceded by England to France
will be immediately taken possession of—the expedi-
ents are fitting out in the French ports.

The Plague rages at Scio and at Smyrna.

The French Funds are at 64.

The Committee of Underwriters at Lloyd's have
given £500 British, to the families and relatives of five
sailors who perished near Donaghadee, when render-
ing assistance to the ship Casar, on the Sal Martin
bank, in October last.

The greatest preparations are making at Oxford for the
reception of our Royal and illustrious visitors. Christ
Church is to be the residence of the Prince Regent, and
St. John's, Queen's, Trinity, Magdalen, and New Col-
lege (to the two latter of which the Proctors belong), all
readily expect the honour of entertaining portions of the
great Foreigners.

With the exception of Colonel Campbell, who sailed
with Bonaparte from Frejus to Elba, all the Commis-
sioners of Allied Sovereigns, who accompanied him
from Fontainebleau to the coast, are now in London.

We understand that among the curiosities belonging
to Bonaparte, which it was judged expedient to trans-
fer to the respective Courts of the Allies, there is a
singular correspondence, in cypher, on the subject of
present events, between Bonaparte, Murat King of
Naples, and the Crown Prince of Sweden.
