They then entered Michael Cowney's house; and lastly, the house of one Lacy, a man;—at the latter place a dog that followed them remained; all deny knowing whose dog it is, these transactions were kept secret, till disclosed by chance. It appears that they were enjoined to secrecy. There were about ten men—those that entered were not disguised.

Thursday night, at about ten o'clock, the servant of Mr. Smithwick, of Barnlough, near Clonmel, detected two men taking away his horses. On being informed thereof, he went out and was instantly surrounded by a number of men mounted and well armed with blunderbusses; Mr. Smithwick immediately returned their fire, and was confident must have wounded one of them severely, as the horse was found next morning with a quantity of blood on his back and sides.
