Cavendish was tried on 21 counts of robbing the Newfoundland and Quebec fleets, to the amount of about 150 sail, under convoy of his ship Captain, and the Cruizer and Galloper, which were taken from the harbour of Cork.

Edward Stewart is appointed a Lord of his Majesty's Privy Council.
