DIED.—At 7 o'clock, on Saturday evening, at his
seat at Plassey, near this city, aged 82, Thos. Maun-
sell, Esq. one of the Common Council of this City.
He spent several years in an important and distin-
guished situation in the East Indies, and after hav-
ing returned from thence, he was sixteen years a
Member in the Irish Parliament, also a candidate for
the representation of this his native City. Anxious
to place Limerick in that light which its rising Com-
mercial prosperity dictated, he caused the establish-
ment of a Bank, on the 1st of July, 1789, and was
the head of the Firm of that respectable House for
25 years. When in 1796, the measure of the Yeo-
manry force was conceived by Government, Mr.
Maunsell was most zealous on the occasion, and by
the formation of the Merchants' Corps, added effi-
ciency and strength to the disposable troops of the
country. To enter into a detail of the active and
useful public avocations in which he was engaged,
would be impossible; and in private life, he embrac-
ed all those affectionate, tender, amiable, and bene-
volent qualities, which added dignity to human na-
ture, and rendered him a most praiseworthy exam-
ple to all with whom he was acquainted, or had in-
tercourse in the various transactions of a well
spent life.—In Dublin, on Friday evening, the
Rev. Averil Hill, D. D. Archdeacon of Limerick,
and Register of the Dioceses of Limerick, Ar-
fert and Aghadoe, to the inexpressible grief of
his wife and nine young children, as well as to a nu-
merous and highly respectable family, and extensive
connexions—He was for many years the Patron of
that valuable Institution the Fever Hospital, and ma-
ny other Charities in this City, which trusts he dis-
charged in a truly praise worthy manner.—He was
allowed by all, to be a Gentleman of enlarged ca-
pacity and learning; he was a most sincere disinter-
ested friend, benevolent without ostentation—he fed
the widow, and was a parent to the orphan. His
loss whether considered as a father, husband, adviser
or benefactor, may be considered as truly calamit-
ous. His remains are to be interred this day in the
family vault at St. Munch n's, in this City.—Yester-

of the most amiable and esteemed character.—On
