

Secretary to Lord Manners, sailed on Tuesday for Holyhead, on their way to London. The Assizes of Dundalk commenced, and on Wednesday morning. The criminal business of the night, and no offence of a very aggravated nature appeared on the Calendar. The Lord Primate of Ireland and suite, arrived at Donaghadee from Portpatrick on Monday.
