City Convictions.

Patrick Punch, convicted of manslaughter, and
acquitted of the murder of *Cornelius Fratey*, to be
imprisoned 12 months, burned in the hand, and
give security for his good behaviour.—*John M. Na-*
mara & James O'Brien, convicted of a riot and as-
sault on *Patrick Ryan*, to be each imprisoned 12
months, and give security for good behaviour.

County Convictions

Daniel Foubie, indicted for the murder of *James*
Donovan, guilty of manslaughter, to be confined
3 months and find bail.

John Lee, indicted for the murder of *Joseph Cul-*
linan, to be burned on the hand, confined for 12
months and find bail.

Bryan Mara, for sheep-stealing to be transported
for seven years.

John Aldwell, for Pig-stealing, to be transported
for seven years.

Patrick Cahill, *Mich. Cahill*, *James Devaney*, and
James Travis, convicted of manslaughter of *John*
Sherin, to be burned in the hand, and confined for
one year.

David Carty, for a violent assault on a Sheriff's
Bailiff, to be confined for one year.

Dennis Merrigan, convicted of manslaughter of
Thomas Coughlan, to be burned in the hand, and
to be confined for three months.

John Holmes, for assembling by night, to be
whipped and confined one month.

Thomas Berrane, *Darby Griffin*, and *John Berrane*,
for assembling by night and turning up ground, the
former to be whipped at *Genlary*, on the 18th in-
stant, and the two latter to be whipped next May,
and all to be confined one year.

Patrick Reily, *Mich. Gearan*, *David Syms*, *Mau-*
rice Roche, *James Coleman*, for assembling by night
and turning up ground, *Reily* to be whipped on
the 11th inst. at *Gurranebreagh*, and the four lat-
ter in May next, and all to be confined one year.

John Quane was tried on Tuesday for the murder
of *John Gleeson*. The Jury disagreed in their ver-
dict, (11 for finding guilty, and 1 for acquittal,) and
were at the termination of the Assizes conducted to
the bounds of the County and discharged.—*Quane*
is remitted to prison until next Assizes, when he is
to be again tried.

Mr. Mich. Keys, of *Mitchelstown*, was tried for
shooting a man named *Sheehan*, at *Spittle*, in this
County, and was honorably acquitted. It appears
that *Sheehan*, with others, were illegally turning
up ground and much to *Keys's* credit he went in

shot and mortally wounded *Sheehan*. The Court

for the spirited conduct of *Keys*, and if his conduct
