Friday next, the troops in Garrison, under the command of Major-General Barry, consisting of a Brigade of Artillery, 1st King's Dragoons, 61st, 1st battalion; 71st, 1st bat. Sigo and Lancashire Regiments, will assemble and fire a *feu de joie* in honor of the Prince Regent's birth day. The Yeomanry brigade are also to parade with the Garrison, on which occasion, first Captain Vincent, (in absence of Commandant, Lord Kiltarton,) requests a full attendance of officers.

The Officers of the King's County Regiment, have unanimously returned Public Thanks to their excellent Colonel H. P. L'Estrange, Esq. for his uniform kindness and attention towards them since the formation of the regiment to the day of its being disembodied.

Upwards of 150 of the King's County Regiment after being disembodied, entered into the 28th regiment that are on their route from Birr for Cork to embark for America. The 74th Regiment have succeeded the 28th in Birr.

The Waterford Regiment arrived in Waterford on Friday, and were disembodied this day. The City Dublin were disembodied at Chislehurst on Monday.

The Armagh Regiment are not yet disembodied; they have proceeded for Athlone, and are stationed at Ballymahon, Mullingar, &c.

The Westmeath Regiment are to be disembodied on Monday.

The Antrim Regiment have left Perth for their own County.

The 48th Regiment have left Clonmel for embarkation.

The 21st, 29th, and 62d Regiments arrived at Bermuda from Gibraltar, on the 6th July, on their route to North America.

Monday and yesterday, the 1st and 2d battalion 40th Regt passed through this City, on a route to embark at Cove for North America.

The 16th Regiment infantry have arrived at Canada, from Cork.

The 15th Royal Veteran Battalion, station at Lisbon, is ordered to England, and will be disbanded.

The 4th Garrison Battalion, about 1200 strong, are to be reduced on the 24th instant, being limited-service men, and stationed so long at Guernsey.

The 68th regiment have marched from Fermoy, to be stationed in Clonmel.

We hear that all the Cavalry Corps of Yeomanry are to be immediately reduced, and that eighteen senior Brigade Majors are to be retained on full pay, the remainder are to be placed on half pay. The six Inspecting Field Officers of Yeomanry, are also to retire on half pay.

Major-Gen. Lord Aylmer, who was lately placed on the Staff of Ireland, is appointed to command the Centre District, comprising the Queen's and King's County and County Westmeath. Headquarters at Tullamore.
