White; Cyane, Captain Falcon, and three store-ships, having 36 merchantmen under convoy; parted company from the 30th ult. off the banks of Newfoundland, and the Harbinger, Lord Wellington, Camden, and Scirling, joined the *Æolus* next morning, and arrived safe. The *Æolus* does not bring any news of any events of the war in America, since the unfortunate fall of Fort Erie, and the still more unfortunate attack at Sandy Creek, on Lake Ontario.

The fraudulent practice of mixing lime, sand, or flour with feathers, has induced the respectable Merchants dealing therein to be on the alert, in consequence of which a fellow was this week convicted before Alderman Watson, and fined 40s. which was immediately handed over to purchase straw for the lunatics, in the cells of the House of Industry, the number of which miserable and unhappy of our fellow creatures sent there from all parts of this county, has far exceeded any since the year 1774.

Affair of Honor—In consequence of some trifling dispute at a dance, the previous evening, on Sunday morning, at an early hour, Michael Sheehan, of Clough, a common farmer, and Michael Donnelly, of the same occupation, met near the village of Craugh, to settle their dispute in an honorable manner—the *Seconds* having placed the combatants on the ground, both struck at each other with LOADED sticks, when the former received a wound in the temple from Donnelly, which unfortunately proved mortal.—The following day, John Cox, Esq. a Coroner, held an Inquest on the body of Sheehan—several witnesses were examined, by which it appeared that the deceased had sent the challenge—Verdict, Died from a blow of a stick, received from Donnelly.

It is our painful duty to record another horrible assassination in the neighbourhood of Cashel. On Monday evening, about four o'clock, as Mr. Isaac Fawcett was riding home from Cashel, about the distance of two miles and a half from that city, he was waylaid by three or four ruffians, who came behind him and shot him between the shoulders, of which he died in the course of ten minutes. It will be recollected that, about nine months ago, Mr. Fawcett and several other persons were marked out for destruction, in posted notices at Clonoulty; and that, in pursuance thereof, Mr. Fawcett's house was attacked by a banditti on Christmas Day, when it was gallantly defended by one of his sons, who was supposed to have shot some of the assailants. Mr. Fawcett was a man highly esteemed for every domestic and social virtue; and his having been a victim in the open day to cowardly assassination, must excite the abhorrence and alarm of every individual not totally dead to the feelings of humanity, and the security of the public at large.

Mr. Scott, of Rossmore Bleach Green, County Tipperary, has got notice that the same fate awaits him that attended Mr. Fawcett.
