 The North America and other fleets sailed from  
 Cove on Wednesday, with a fair wind.  
 A few days ago, a transport having Capt. Argles,  
 Royal Navy, late Regulating Officer at this port,

 American privateer off the head of Kinsale—Capt.  
 Argles and his family, were released on paying  
 £500 ransom to the American Captain, and have  
 arrived in safety at Plymouth.  
 The Corporation of Cork on Monday last, voted  
 the Freedom of that City to the Rt. Hon. S. Abbot,  
 Speaker of the House of Commons, J. W. Dunster-  
 ville, Esq. Agent to the Victualling Office, (which  
 important and arduous situation he has filled for 20  
 years, with honor and integrity in that harbour) and  
 to Admiral Sawyer, commanding at Cove—the latter  
 was yesterday presented by a deputation, in a silver  
 Box.  
 Mr. James Frith is appointed Post Master of

 The Rambler, Godfrey, from this port, arrived  
 in London, on Saturday last  
 Tuesday last, our justly celebrated Races on the  
 Newcastle Course terminated; nothing could exceed

 all their festivity there was not even a sign of dis-  
 turbance. The running was most interesting—the  
 scenery of the Course was beautiful, and could any  
 thing add to the eclat with which the routine of  
 amusement went off, it would be the morning and  
 evening exhibition of Madame Catalani &c.  
 Wednesday last, at the Fair of Mount-Pellier, in  
 this Co. two violent factions, one from O'Brien's-  
 Bridge, Co. Clare, the other from Gouge, County  
 Tipperary, assembled in the Green to fight, and  
 which was continued for many hours to the great  
 terror of those who went to traffic at the fair; the  
 fellows were armed with muskets, pistols, scythes, and  
 other instruments of destruction, which were deat  
 about freely and effectually, as several were despe-  
 rately wounded, some of whom are in a dying way;  
 it is to be regretted that there was not a military  
 detachment in the village to protect the peaceable  
 inhabitants—some Magistrates interfered with the  
 rioters, and the conflict would have terminated  
 much sooner if their efforts were seconded, by ap-  
 prehending the ringleaders, who are known to be  
 constant rioters.  
 On Saturday last, James O'Brien, a lad  
 thirteen years, the son of a widow in Nicholas street,  
 was run over by a horse at the Race Course, and the  
 hoof of it broke the child's skull; he languished in  
 much pain until Thursday evening, in the County  
 Hospital, when death relieved his sufferings. The  
 Mayor held an inquest on the body—Verdict "Ac-  
 cidental Death."
