The great Fair of Ballinasloe ended on Saturday
last—the prices for sheep were very considerable,
particularly ewes; there were 72,570 sold, and 6000
unsold Black cattle uncommonly low and very
few disposed of The principal premiums granted
by the Farming Society for the several exhibitions,
were awarded to Sir Thos. Newcomen, Bart. Thos.
Going, Esq of Traverston, and Ross Mahon, Esq.
of Castlegar.

Monday last, John Burns, a horse rider, who
was training a horse in the village of Patrick's well,
in this County, was thrown from the animal and was
unfortunately killed.—Arthur H. D'Esterie, Esq.
Coroner, yesterday held an Inquest on the body,
verdict accidental death.

The Brig Aurora, Capt. M'Arvill, which sailed
from Belfast for Quebec, a few days ago, sprung a
leak at the entrance of this harbour on Thursday
last—the passengers perceiving their danger hasten-
ed to the small boats, and with difficulty were saved
(as the vessel foundered in five minutes after, and 2
of the sailors were drowned,) some of the crew
made for Carrigaholt, where they were kindly receiv-
ed by George Nolan, Esq. who protected them
from plunder; another boat ventured off the coast,
at Moveens, near Killkee—the surf was so violent
that two herdsmen of Ralph Westropp, Esq. who
humanely put out in a canoe for to assist the stran-
gers coming in, were carried out to sea and have not
since been heard of.—It is supposed they perished;
the boat from the Aurora however reached the
shore in safety—the passengers who arrived here on
Friday last, have requested us to publish the fol-
lowing viz:—

"We the undersigned passengers, who had en-
gaged our passage for Quebec, on board the Brig
Aurora, (but which vessel sprung a leak, and was
obliged to put back, and unfortunately foundered
off Malbay, on Thursday the 6th inst) return our
most sincere thanks to George Nolan, Esq of Car-
rigaholt, for his kind attention to us in our dis-
tressed situation, and preventing the inhabitants
from plundering what little clothes we could save.

The Carbury, of and for London, Jameson, Cu-
wacoa, coffee, cotton, indigo, &c was taken by the
Chasseur, American privateer, and retaken by his
Majesty's sloop, Castilian, and arrived at Cove on
Saturday last.

A boy between four and five years of age, the son
of John Mares, of John's Gate, in the absence of
his parents, was burned to death on Sunday last, by
going too close to the fire—this is the third melan-
choly accident of a similar description that has oc-
curred in this City within the last fortnight.

John Wilson Croker, Esq. Secretary to the Ad-
miralty, has intimated to the Chamber of Commerce
of this City, that a convoy from Spithead will sail
on the 22th instant (this day) and will call at Cork
for such vessels as are bound for Newfoundland &c.

Yesterday the Mayor, fined 20 carmen ten pence
each, for not conforming to the Quay Regulations.—

Denmark street, which he seized for not having the
