The George, Wilkinson, from Cork to Jamaica,

which she engaged for half an hour, when three
other privateers heaving in sight and her foremast
shot away, and three men badly wounded, when
she struck. In 27 hours, the Venus took four
or five vessels, one of which was given up to the
crews, and arrived at Beaumaris.

The Brazen, Capt. Sterling, is now in this River to
convoy such Merchant vessels as may be ready to
proceed hence for the British Channel.

The Hon. and Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of
Cork and Ross, held his annual Catechistical exami-
