THE County of Limerick is deeply interested in the
issue of the Great Question, whether the Corn
Laws shall be strengthened or continue at their present
pitch. It is therefore with great pleasure I commu-
nicate to you the determination just announced by his
Majesty's Ministers, of their intention to support a
bill which will be immediately introduced giving some
further protection to the Agricultural interest of the
United Empire.

I indulge a sanguine hope that I shall soon have to
congratulate my Countrymen, on the passing of a wise
and necessary Regulation.—Yet the example of last
Sessions shews, that we must not expect to complete
any alteration of the Corn Laws, however salutary,
without very formidable opposition.

I have been induced to make this communication
by an anxious desire to remove as soon as possible,
some part of the well founded alarm that most pervade
the minds of my constituents—and I have the honour
