Rowland Reeves, who was tried and acquitted at the law Assizes of this City, on a charge of uttering and vending forged Stamps on the covers of playing cards, &c. was summoned before the Mayor on Saturday last by Mr. Speight, Inspector of Stamps, and fully convicted in the penalty of £20 British, for having in his possession at the time of his arrest, several packs of playing cards, without being stamped, marked or sealed, as required by law; under this conviction, the act of the 5th Geo. 3d, chap. 87, authorises the Commissioner of Stamp Duties to withdraw the License of Reeves as also to enforce the penalties forfeited by his bonded securities.—(Cork Intelligencer).
