A PROCLEM TION. W. ARMAGH. MANNELS C G. HEWETT. HEREAS by an Act of Carliament passed in the Fifty-fourth year of his present Majesty, entited, " An Act for the bester execution of the Laws in Ireland, by appointing Superintending Magistrates, and additional constables in counties, in certain cases;" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, for the time being, by the advice of the Privy Council of Ireland, to declare by Proclamation that any county, evenly of a city, or county of a town in Ireland, or any barney or barnnies or half barony or half baronies, in any county at large, to be therein specified, is or are to a state of disturbance, and requires or require an extraordinary establishment of polices

AND whereas it has sufficiently appeared to us, that the haronies of Kilnemanagh and Elioguity, in the Co. of Tipperary, are in a state of distribunce, and require an extraordinery establishment of police.

NOW We the Lords Justices, by and with the advice of his Majesty's Privy Connect, by virtue of the said act, and the powers thereby vested in os, do by this our Proclamation declare, that the said baronies of Kitnesmanagh and Etioguriy, in the county of Tipperary, in this part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, are in a state of disturbance, and require an extraordinary establishment of police.
