The troops Just arrived at Portsmouth, from the late expedition to New Orleans, are ordered to proceed forthwith to the Downs, on their way to Belgrum, without waiting to be trans-shipped to other vessels for more convenient conveyance, as was at first intended; the importance of a speedy junction with the Duke of Wellington having superseded the minor motives for the other arrangement. The officers, who have been permitted to land at Porrsmouth, and to come up to town, are under orders to join again at Deal, on the arrival of the ships in the Downs

The arrival of these troops, we understand, is anxiously desired by the illustrious Duke, most of them having fought and distinguished themselves under 'him in the campaigns in the Peninsula, and or the south of France. In point of actual service, these regiments may, in fact, he considered the flower of the British army ; and as such they were selected for the enterprizes upon which they have been recently employed; and, although from particular circumstances they have not allbeen equally successful in the late instance, we are confident that when replaced under their old commander, " the ten thousand," as the soldiers familarly but forcibly called the Duke of Wellington, they will win their way to glory with equal vigous and certainty as before.

The prominent feature of the British army in Belgium at present is its train and corps of artillery, which are probably the finest ever attached to any force. The cavalry also are considered a very fine body. But the infantry regiments in general are considered unequal; on account of the very circumetance of the best regiments having been hitherto all on the American service.

The Treasurer to the Fever Hospital, has received from Mrs. Twaither, £2 14s. 2d. and from G. H. Ievers, Esq. one Guinea (the latter an annual subscription) for that charity, Though the inhabitants of this populous and wealthy city must be aware of the unusual prevalence of fever this season, they will perhaps be surprised to learn that from the 1st to the 29th May, fifty one persons in fever have been admitted into the Hospital, of whom to this day 23 were discharged cured, 31 are in a progressive state of recovery, and of the entire number only one died, and he within a few hours after admission, more in consequence of hurts received from a fall than from the effects of fever - probably in no part of the empire could there be found a more striking instance of skill and success in the treatment of fever than the present, nor can any thing more strongly evince the utility of this institution, or call more foudly for liberal and permanent support for it. Had not the Fever Hospital been open for the admission of those 51 individuale, it is impossible to say where the ravages of contagion would have stopped - yet this most valuable institution is deeply in acht, and its funds for the present exhausted.
