### ATTACK ON THE MAIL COACH.

The Coach for Dublin, by Cashel, which left Cork last Wednesday, at 2 o'clock, was attacked between Cahir and Cashel by a set of villains, who, with a cowardice inseparable from treachery, fired seven shots from behind the hedges, and so far succeeded in their diabolical design, as to wound the coachman, who received two slugs in his head, but who, notwithstanding, drove on the coach to Cashel, where he was relieved, and we are glad to state is not considered in any serious danger. On the spot where the attack was made, the road was impeded by cars and trunks of trees, placed across, which in order to enable the coach to pass, were obliged to be removed by the guards, after they had succeeded in making the villains fly, by discharging their arms in the direction the shots proceeded from. We learn that an active search was immediately commenced by the police, when intimation of the outrage reached Cashel, and we sincerely trust it will prove successful. — *Cork S. Reporter*
