A vessel arrived at Cork from Kingston, Jamaica, states, that Port Royal, was burned down on the 13th of July.

The loss sustained, in the Jamaica fleet, according to the underwriter at Lloyd's, is estimated at near £100,000.

The Hon. H. Caulfield has been declared the Member in Parliament for the Co. Armagh, Mr. Brownlow having relinquished the contest.

Thursday next, the Right Rev. Lord Bishop of Limerick, will hold an Ordination at the Cathedral of this city.

In addition to the horrid Catalogue of murders which have lately taken place, we have to mention, on Friday night last, that of Thomas Dillon and his wife on the Lands of Castle Town in this County. It appears that this ill fated man gave his evidence at our last Assizes against some of these midnight villains, and for the honest and faithful discharge of a public duty, he and his poor wife are snatched, by the dagger of the assassin, from a young and helpless family of five orphans.

On the night of Monday se'night, the house of John Gleeson, an industrious farmer, at Ballymacstradeeg, near Croom in this county was consumed to ashes by a number of villains, Gleeson and his wife narrowly escaped the flames.

A fellow has been committed to Ennis Jail charged with violating the person of a child of three years old!

An English Gentleman of the name of Kean was assassinated on Wednesday last, on the Boulevard de Coblentz near the Rue Fatout, by one of those ferocious brigands lately arrived in Paris from the army of the Loire. The French officer accused Mr. Kean of having trodden on his feet, which the latter positively denied. High words then ensued, when the Frenchman drew a dagger from his cane, and gave Mr. Kean a mortal stab in the side. He expired the next day. After Mr. Kean fell the French officer quietly retired, taking under his arm one of the fair cyprians who frequent this Boulevard, and has not since been heard of. Not one of the French journalists, to their great shame be it spoken, have dared to notice this horrid assassination, though attended with circumstances of the most aggravating nature—*London Pilot*

We regret to state that the Gentleman above alluded to, is Mr. P. Kean of Bruff, in this County. We understand that the Duke of Wellington has offered a large reward for the apprehension of the assassin.

The Prussian Governor of Paris has sent to the Police, a formal notice that unless the assassin be surrendered up to justice within ten days from the date of this notice, the *First French Officers* seized the following day on the Boulevards, where Mr. Kean was assassinated, shall be hanged.

Desperate attack on the Cashel Coach.

A Dublin and Cork Coach, by Cashel, which has just arrived, sustained a desperate attack last night, which was attended with most fatal consequences. About five miles at the other side of Cashel, near Grange gate, the road was discovered to be intercepted by several cars and a ladder, placed across the ways. Two smart fellows, sailors, descended from the top of the coach, and were proceeding to clear the road, when a volley was fired from inside the coaches, by which it was feared one of the sailors was killed, as he could not be found after, and the other was wounded.
