LONDON—MONDAY Nov. 20.

It appears certain that the Treaty will be signed before Sunday, the 19th. We may hope for this the more confidently as the departure of Lord Castlereagh for England, and of Prince Hardenberg for Berlin, has been announced for the beginning of next week.

The Offices of the Prussian Commandant Pfuhl will be dissolved at the same time, and the Prussian Officers will go into the offices English Commandant.

Madame Murat received the news of her husband's death with the most profound indifferences. Madam Bacchiochi, her sister, on the contrary, fainted. She was on a visit to Madam Murat, but has since returned to Brun.

LONDON—THURSDAY, Nov. 16.

Arrival of the Signed Treaties with France.

At length we are able to announce that Mr. Planta, Secretary to Lord Castlereagh, has arrived with the treaty between the Allied Powers and France, He landed at Dover yesterday evening, & reached town at six o'clock this morning. A PROCLAMATION.

WITHWORTH,

WHEREAS by an act of parliament passed in the Fifty-fourth Year of his present Majesty, intitled, "An act to provide for the preserving of the peace in such parts of Ireland, as at any time be disturbed by seditious persons entering into unlawful combinations or conspiracies;" it is enacted, that it shall be the duty of the justices of the peace of any county, assize or extraordinary session of the peace summoned in pursuance of the said act, directed, and pursuant to the provisions therein contained, not being less than seven, in a county at large, or than three in a city town, or the major part of them, if it shall appear upon due consideration of the state of the county, to signify by memorial, by them signed to the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of the county, or any part thereof, to be in a state of disturbance, or in immediate danger of becoming so, the grounds and reasons of such their opinion, and that the Lord Lieutenant and Council may, in pursuance of the said act, direct, and pursuant to the provisions therein contained, that such county, or any part thereof, to be in a state of disturbance, or in immediate danger of becoming so, and thereupon it shall any may be lawful to the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, for the time being, by the advice of his Majesty's Privy Council in that behalf advised, to declare, such county, or any part thereof, to be in a state of disturbance, or in immediate danger of becoming so, as also such he or they shall think proper of any adjoining county.

AND whereas sixteen justices of the peace of the county of Westmeath, being the major part of the justices of the peace duly summoned and assembled in pursuance of the said act, at an extraordinary session of the peace to be holden in and for said county of Westmeath, on the second day of November last, and do holden pursuant to the said act, have by memorial, signed, signified to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, that the Baronies of Clonlunan and Moycashel, in the said county of Westmeath, are in a state of disturbance, and the grounds and reasons of such opinion; and have thereby prayed that the Lord Lieutenant and Council may proclaim the said county of Clonlunan and Moycashel to be in a state of disturbance.

NOW we the Lord Lieutenant by and with the advice of his Majesty's privy council, in pursuance of the said act, do hereby by this our proclamation, declare the county of Clonlunan and Moycashel, in the county of Westmeath, to be in a state of disturbance, and do hereby warn the inhabitants of the said Baronies of Clonlunan and Moycashel, that they each and every of them, be and remain within their houses, at the town of Moate, in the said county, on the twenty-ninth day of November instant, the twenty-ninth day of November next, the twenty-ninth day of November next, under the penalties by law established; and do hereby order and direct, that a Special Session of the Peace for the said County of Westmeath, be holden at the town of Moate, in the said county, on the twenty-ninth day of November instant, for the purposes expressed in the said Act of Parliament, which all Justices of the Peace, and other Magistrates of the said county, and all others whom it may concern, are to take notice.

Given at the Council Chamber, in Dublin, the 24th day of November, 1815.
