Extract of a Letter dated Clonmel, Jan. 22.

One conviction only took place this day, for a robbery on Mr Blackmore, near Fethard; the prisoner's name is J. Mara—Three were discharged, for taking forcible possession and assembling in arms, the prosecutor turning out to be totally unworthy of credit. Some others of respectability and of the best character, the Murphys, from near Cashel, pleaded guilty; it is supposed, from the nature of their offence not being great, that they will meet the merciful consideration of Government. The storm is nearly over. God grant us peace in this disturbed and unhappy county! It is supposed the Commission will end on Thursday. Michael Stack, for the murder of Wm. Meany, was hanged this day at Camus, near Cashel; and two men were executed at Cahir, for taking arms from Mr. Dudley near that town."
