

The plot of this little piece is very interesting, and the performance perfectly in unison with its title—each character was supported by Mr. TALBOT! He anticipates the ideas of all, before they are able to give them utterance, whilst he does it with volubility almost unequalled. His legitimate character is that of *Captain Allclack*, but he assumes that of a French Count, a Jew Broker, and of his own Mother, a Scotch Lady, in each of which he was perfectly at home—the changing of his dress was effected almost without missing him off the stage, and at the conclusion he sung a song, a verse of which is designed for each character, with the prettiest effect—The piece was highly applauded throughout, & sheds much lustre on the talents, the matchless talents—of this elegant, this accomplished performer, for whom, “take him for all in all,” we can find no equal.

Last night, the *Comedy of the Sons of Erin*, and *Boheration*, was performed at this Theatre, for the benefit of Mr. WEBB—the parts of *O'Shea* and *O'Blarney*, were ably sustained by that Gentleman. The other characters were exceedingly well filled, and the play went off with great spirit.—In the course of the evening, Mr. Webb sang some beautiful Irish songs with bewitching sweetness, and others with irresistible drollery. *A Pus de Deux*, by Mrs. SMITH and Miss ESCHER, was danced with their accustomed gracefulness—the private character and professional talents of these interesting females, have rendered them, very deservedly, great favourites with the public, their appearance is always greeted with the warmest plaudits, and their exertions to please, are uniformly successful.

CASE FOR MR. BRUCE.

“The paper submitted to Mr. Bruce relative to income, when I was with him in Limerick, is sent herewith as it appears correct, and as Mr. Bruce has already made some observations upon it.

“There is also sent herewith a specific statement of debts charging the land, and of my own personal debts.

“In addition to those is whatever Mr. Bruce is now in advance.

“This appears so serious, that I am convinced nothing can save me, from disgrace and degradation but the decided and systematic interposition of Mr. Bruce's head, heart, and hand.

“And there is nothing consolatory in the entire, but the consciousness of my being abundant security to such extent, as it may be necessary for him to interpose.

“It is also to be considered that I have no means of supplying the growing expences of the house, and that the rents of next July will be much more than absorbed before due.
