To Persons keeping Kilns for drying, or Mills for grinding Corn, Grain or Malt.

The Commissioners of Idland Excise and Takes; hereby give notice, that by an Act of the 36th of the King, ch. 112, it is educted, that from and after the first day of October next, every person who shall keep any Kiin for drying of any Corn, Grain, or Mall, shall, on pain of forfeiting Ten Pounds, in case of detault; make out, sign, and deliver, an account in writing to the Guager, or other Officer in charge of the Walk id which the Kilo is situate; and that every person was shall keep any Mill for the grinding of Corn; or grains or Malt, shall, on pain of forfeiting fifty pontide, ist case of default, make out, sign and deliver an account in writing to the Collector of the District id which the Mill is situated, specifying and describing in such account respectively, the name and place of abode of such person, and the place, where such Kild or Mill is respectively situated, and shall cause to Be painted in Oil Colour, in black upon a white ground; or in white upon a black ground, on the outside of the door of, or place of cotrance of every such Kill or Mill respectively, of on a board to be ashied on some conspicuous part outside of such Kiln or Mill in legible letters, at least three inches in length; this name and surpame of the owner or proprietor of such Mill or Kiln, such account to be a good by the Guager; Officer, or Collector, who is to give a copy signed by blin, to the Party; and all Corp or Grain, or Mail found in or on any such Kila or Mill respectively, of which such account shall not be delivered will be forfeited; and if upon any such Kin or Mal, the nared and surname of the proprietor thereof respectively; shall not be, and remain so painted and legible as aforesaid, the person to whom such Kiln or Millshall belong, forfeits ten pounds, and before any such account of any such Mill shall be received, the person keeping the same, shall with one or more sufficient Surety or Sureties; enter into a bond to his Majesty, in the sum of fifty pounds, conditioned to pay all such penalties as such person shall be subject to lor having in the Mill any Malt for which such person shall not produce a proper permit for removal thereof, to such Mill ; and that such person shall not receive or griffde or suffer to be received or ground in such mill soy Malt which shall not be attended by a proper Permis to such Mill.

And the Act authorises any Excise Officer, at any time in the day time, to enter and search any Mill for the grinding of corn, or grain, or mall, whate in eng district in Ireland, mentioned in any notice which shall bave been, or shall be given by the Commissioners of laised Excise, under the provisions of the illicit distillation acis: and if such Officer shall not on demand or within a reasonable time after such demand made at the place of abode of the person keeping such Mitt, obtain admittance therein; such Officer may (in the presence of a Constable, or other peace Officer: who is by the act authorised and required to aid and assist) break open and enter such mill and every store and room therein, and make scarch for any malt which such Officer may have reasonable of probable eaged to suspect to be concealed or fraudulently deposited.
