A cause of some importance lately came before the corporation court of Enniskillen, the particulars of which it may be useful to many of our readers to know. James Heavy, private in the Donegal militia, who was arrested under an attachment issued by the provost, pleaded the provisions of the mutiny act, by which soldiers are exempted from imprisonment for debt, and claimed to be dismissed from custody accordingly. The provost, conceiving that the law could not be intended to apply to disbanded militia men, submitted the circumstances to the Lord Lieutenant, who stated, in reply, that the provost's construction, of the mutiny act was perfectly correct, inasmuch as the exemptions from arrests for sums under £21 do not extend to any men of the disembodied corps of militia, with the exception of the staff.

A shock of an earthquake was felt at Londonderry on Wednesday night. The northern pinnacle of the steeple was rent in twain, and several trees torn up; two sailors were so much injured, that their lives are despaired of.
