"The above-named Arthur Connor and Anne

M'Mullan, are believed never to have received any christian savrament, or christian communicating sacrament in any christian, regal, legal, established church, since their christian baptism-no nor their marriage, subscribing witnesses. "Therefore, it is believed, that neither of them

is, of any christian church, a firm, fixed member, and believed to be of present liberty to profess themselves members of any christian church, as their best knowledge, consciousness, &c. &c. may please to direct them to make choice of. "The above-named Rev. Jas. M. V. M'Cary,
