By the united efforts of all, the fire had been in hereat measure, got under by one o'clock. Mr. cointin of the Pipe water office belonging to that e ablishment, opened as soon as possible, two seven inch mains in Castle street, which gave a very great supply of water. It would be invidious to mention the exertions of any engine, whether Parish or belanging to any Insurance Company in this city, for all, as they arrived, and were supplied with water, were equally on the alert.
