former case. ... being an active agent, and feeling more than the usual interest on those occasions, from a connexion with Mr. Ormsby, studiously endeavoured to prevent the tenants on this estate from committing many acts which were injurious to him, and in a few instances put from the land some men of bad character. He repeatedly got threatening notices, that his life should pay the forfeit if he did not quit the land; but instead of complying with those requisitions, Mr. Franks was prepared to meet them should they attempt an attack, and the cowardly ruffians knowing that, took the present mode of revenge.

We hear that one of the fellows concerned in the above outrage has been apprehended and committed to Clonmel jail. **CLONMEL, APRIL 21.**—On Tuesday morning, about ten o'clock, as the first division of the 82d regt. had passed through Ballyporeen, on their route to Cashel, the Adjutant who was a short way in front with his family in a jaunting car, was attacked by three footpads, two of whom presented and missed fire at him, and the third fired on his servant, who made resistance, and wounded him through the lungs; the poor fellow knocked two of them down after receiving the shot, but was afterwards overpowered by one of the ruffians, who trampled on his neck. Immediately on the shot being heard by the countrymen of the neighbourhood, they in the most praiseworthy manner rose in a body, and headed by an active young fellow of the name of Fennell, effectually secured two of them, viz. William Fitzgerald and James O'Brien—the other accomplice, Neale, unfortunately got off; but there is strong reason to suppose, if he is not already apprehended, he soon will, as he is well known in the country, having committed various depredations before.—Fitzgerald escaped from Cashel bridewell on a former occasion—he and O'Brien are now in Clonmel jail. Lord Lismore, Joshua Sutton, Esq. and the Rev. C. Tuckey, attended on the spot, where the soldier and adjutant fully identified the two robbers, who acknowledged their guilt. The poor soldier (who was humanely attended by Surgeon Hargrove) is now in Clogheen barrack hospital, and in a doubtful state of recovery.

This report leads us to a serious and an important consideration, and binds us to the discharge of a most imperious duty—from the 6th of Jan. to this date, a period under five months, the number of patients admitted to the Hospital were *four hundred and forty five!* To calculate on what the consequences might be if this Institution was not in existence, is fearful, and we learn, with considerable regret, that the funds are by no means adequate to the expences.—To this most necessary Asylum have we frequently directed public attention, and endeavoured to point out the absolute duty which rests on that public to support it.—Suffering humanity implores—the general good obliges—and the first and most powerful incentive—personal safety, compels! We cannot refrain from paying to the Medical Gentlemen, who attend at the Hospital, (Doctors Grogan and Geary,) that tribute which their active and unceasing exertions in this benevolent cause demands.—The almost uniform success they have had, must be very gratifying to their feelings, and yield them a far greater pleasure, than it is in the language of eulogy to bestow. We shall for the present, conclude, and commit the miserable victims of disease, to the considerate care of those, who by smoothing the bed of sickness, ensue to themselves an imperishable reward—"A House eternal in the Heavens."

Barry, James Walsh, David Hennessy, James Flinn, James Martin, John Donegan, Thomas Liochan, Ellen Brien, Dan Sweeny, John Sullivan, James Brien, James Murphy, and Pat Shea, various robberies, to be all transported for 7 years—Michael Guinea, suborned perjury before the assistant barrister, imprisoned 3 months, and whipped through the town of Mallow, 30th inst.—Laurence Horgan, alias Seward, for perjury, to be transported for seven years—Pat Daly, manslaughter, imprisoned 12 months, and burned in the hand—Florence Condon, manslaughter, and Cornelius Mahony, ditto, imprisoned 8 months, and burned in the hand—Wm. Stewart, manslaughter, imprisoned 6 months, and burned in the hand—Edw. Connor, sen. and Edw. Connor, jun. stealing potatoes, to be imprisoned 3 months—James Trowdell, stealing a bow and fiddle, to be imprisoned 3 months—Ch. Regan, perjury, to be pilloried 26th inst.—Rich. Power and Daniel Egan, for rescue, the former to be imprisoned 6 months and fined £30, the latter to be imprisoned 3 months—Owen M'Auliffe, for the attack on the late sub sheriff, to be imprisoned 6 months and fined £50—Charles Callaghan and Mary Callaghan for receiving stolen goods, to be imprisoned one month—Callaghan M'Carthy, for rescue, to be imprisoned 6 months, and fined £50—Daniel Brien, stealing timber, to be imprisoned 3 months, and give security.
