Forty barrels of meal, and a large quantity of

 on board a vessel bound to Dublin, by Geo. H.
 Read. They are to be disposed of to the poor.

 Liverpool on Thursday se'night

The Honourable and Reverend John Pomeroy, was,
 on yesterday week, elected to the vacant deanery of
 St. Patrick's. The appointment of this humane and
 very respectable gentleman, has afforded general sa-
 tisfaction.

Several cars were stopped on Monday last, between
 the Nineteen mile house and Cappagh hill, in the
 county of Kildare, on the Mullingar road, and the pro-
 visions with which they were loaded all carried off.—
 The number of the depredators was between two and
 three hundred.

On the 19th instant, there was shipped by the agent
 for the bank of Scotland at Aberdeen, on board one
 of the London smucks, old coin collected there, to the
 amount of £90,000.

New potatoes have made their appearance in the Isle
 of Man, and are sold at 1s per lb.

The present stock of sheep in Great Britain and Ire-
 land, is estimated at forty two millions; more than
 thirty millions of which are of the short wooled spe-
 cies.
