## LONDON MARKETS, JUNE 24.

IRISH PROVISIONS, &c.—There is no material alteration in the prices of Beef and Pork; Bacon is still heavy.—The holders of Butters evince a great disposition to get clear of the old stock of Irish butter, previous to the arrival of the new; public sales in consequence are brought forward, at which very reduced rates were submitted to; the market is still without any supply of new Butter.

CORN—There was a great sensation produced yesterday in the city, by the reports of the corn market; it was stated that Wheat was falling rapidly; the decline variously stated from 5 to 20s. per quarter. We proceed to the true statement:—The purchasers, as well as the sellers appear panic struck with the uncommon fine weather, the holders wishing to force sales at a great depression, the purchasers refusing to buy at any decline; the medium heat for the last ten days being 82 or 83 in the shade; this sultry weather being preceded by two weeks of almost continual rain, it was therefore calculated, that independently of the prolific season, the crops would be a month sooner in the market than what had been anticipated, and would be ready for immediate use on account of the dry season; added to these considerations, there was plentiful supply of wheats from the neighbouring counties, and 5000 quarters of foreign, and no export demand whatever; every description of wheat may be quoted 12s. per quarter lower.—Stained barley 8s.—Malting samples at a decline of 16s. Notwithstanding the great decline we have stated, the most considerable factors and corn merchants were of opinion that there would be no business done to any extent, until the prices fell under the present currency.
