It is said that a further reduction will take place in the General Officers on the Staff in the West Indies .-There are now four Major-Generals employed there. one at each of the following Islands, viz-Grenada, where half of a regiment is stationed; Antigua, where live regiments are; at Tobago, where only two companies are; and at Demerara, besides a Commander of the Porces at Ba badors. The Governor of St. Lucie. who is a Major General, is not retained on the Staff.
