SHERIFF'S COURT.

Gilchrist, Esq. v. Molloy and others.
This is a Captain in the army; the defendants of the *Hants Telegraph* News-paper of the 4th of August last, contained a paragraph on board the *Larkins*, a transport employed in conveying convicts to Botany Bay, were persons of the name of Gilchrist and had recently been found guilty of forgery, and sentences had been committed: that Gilchrist, ten years ago, had been one of the individuals concerned in the murder of a Lieutenant Bailely in a duel, and a life of great turpitude, he at length emigrated to New South Wales.

During the passage six of the passengers died of typhus fever, one since their arrival, and two more dangerously ill in the Fever House here."

The 6th battalion of the 60th Regiment is to be disbanded forthwith.

It is intended in future that soldiers who desert should be mulct of their pay, instead as heretofore receiving such allowance, though they were not with their corps.
