

Saturday the Special Sessions for the County of Louth were held at Dunloughmeade, before A. G. McCartney, Esq. (who presided in the room of Francis Hamilton, Esq. and a Bench of Justices.—James Callaghan, Thomas Murphy, Patrick Mills, Denis Ryan, James White, John Haughey, Bryan McGeough, were convicted "orderly persons," and received sentences for seven years; the two last by the Magistrates as fit objects for punishment—the remaining nine were committed to Kilmainham, the place of embarkation; five were sent off their trials; and one who was ordered his recognizance.
